### Why "Cultural Center?"

The Cultural Center will provide opportunities for Transylvania County African Americans and the Rosenwald neighborhood to tell their stories and to educate the public about the African influence that impacts their lives.

The word "culture" has a variety of definitions that relate to the purpose and goals of our Cultural Center.

• The quality in a person or society that arises from a concern for what is regarded as excellent in arts, letters, manners, scholarly pursuits, etc.

Programs and events will demonstrate these qualities through the outstanding people you will meet, the rotating exhibits that speak to your history and the skills and talents that have and still do exist in your communities.

• Development or improvement of the mind by education or training.

Education is the bottom line for the Cultural Center. It has been established, basically, for this sole purpose – to teach not only the members of the Black community but also the communityat-large about the African American experience, life before and after integration in the Rosenwald neighbor-hood, influential individuals (both Black and White) who have impacted the community and events that have mattered in the lives of Black citizens in Transylvania County.

• The behaviors and beliefs characteristic of a particular social, ethnic or age group.

Gospel music comes to mind not to mention Soul food. We will go back as far as African symbols and Proverbs to live by that have always given direction as to behavior and beliefs..

• *Anthropology:* the sum total of ways of living built up by a group of human beings and transmitted from one generation to another.

This one sums it all up but now we are attempting to share these experiences with everyone in a variety of ways. From Soul food to music, the art of African fabric to history, this Community and Cultural Center hopes to be both interesting and entertaining as well as extremely educational and maybe even eye opening!

Some of the community members will be trained to conduct tours of the Cultural Center, so that its impact can truly be felt. Do remember that some of the exhibits, both on the walls and in the cabinets, are scheduled to be changed approximately every 3 months so that we can keep the Center fresh and new.
